MEMORANDUM OF COVERAGE

The California State University Risk Management Authority (CSURMA) is an intergovernmental agency, risk sharing, joint powers authority, duly formed pursuant to California Government Code Sections 6500-6512, and other provisions of law.

This Memorandum of Coverage is a contract between the CSURMA Auxiliary Organizations Risk Management Alliance (hereinafter referred to as AORMA) and its Named Members that sets forth certain duties, responsibilities and obligations of each party. This Memorandum of Coverage is not an insurance policy or document, and is not necessarily subject to the particular rules of law that apply to an insurance policy or to interpretation of insurance policies or insurance related documents.

1. COVERAGE AGREEMENT

In consideration of the payment of the required deposit and subject to all the terms of this Memorandum of Coverage, AORMA agrees to pay the Named Member, up to the limit of this Memorandum of Coverage, all losses which you suffer as a result of any claim covered by the terms of the Fidelity Insurance Policy issued by Lloyd's of London, Policy #B0621PTRU00613 for the Coverage Period of July 1, 2013 to July 1, 2014, except as amended by the following provisions:

2. COVERAGE PERIOD

As specified within the Declarations Page, Item 2

3. LIMITS OF LIABILITY

As specified within the Declarations Page, Item 3

4. DEDUCTIBLE AND NAMED MEMBER

As specified within the Declarations Page, Items 1 and 4

5. OTHER COVERAGE

The coverage afforded by this Memorandum of Coverage shall be excess over any other valid and collectible insurance available to the Named Member, whether such other insurance is stated



to be primary, excess, contingent or otherwise, unless such other insurance specifically applies as excess insurance over the limits provided in this Memorandum of Coverage.

6. NOTICE OF LOSS

In the event of loss insured against under this Memorandum of Coverage, the Named Member shall give notice to the CSURMA AORMA's Claims Administrator within 30 days of discovering such loss.

7. PAYMENT OF LOSS

Upon final determination of loss, AORMA will promptly pay the Named Member the amount of loss falling within the terms of this Memorandum of Coverage.

8. SUBROGATION

In the event of any payment under this Memorandum of Coverage, AORMA will be subrogated to all of the Named Member's rights of recovery against any person or organization and the Named Member shall execute and deliver instruments and papers and do whatever else is necessary to secure such rights.

The amount recovered as subrogation shall be apportioned in the inverse order of payment of the loss to the extent of the actual payment. The expenses of all such recovery proceedings shall be apportioned in the ratio of the respective recoveries.

9. CANCELLATION

A Named Member may withdraw from AORMA only at the end of the Coverage Period, and only if the Named Member has given AORMA at least three (3) months' advance written notice of such action.

AORMA may terminate a Member in accordance with the provisions of Section 23 Termination of the CSURMA Joint Powers Agreement.
